Creating your own crayon masterpiece

You will need some wax paper, crayons, an iron and a small pencil sharpener.

Spread out the wax paper on a flat surface. Use the pencil sharpener to peel off shreds of each crayon onto the wax paper. Use as many different crayons as you want. Fold the wax paper in half, making sure to keep the crayon shreds inside the layers of wax paper. With your parent's help, iron the wax paper on a low setting until the crayon shreds melt together. Let the wax paper cool and you have your crayon masterpiece to hang on the wall!



Dried petals

For this activity you will need flower petals and leaves, some wax paper, a heavy book, glue, some card (or chart) paper and some perfume (optional).

Put the petals between 2 sheets of wax paper. Put the wax paper with the petals inside the center of a heavy book (or between two books). Leave them in the book for a couple of days. When the petals are dry take them out and stick them on some chart paper with glue (in whatever design you want). Cut out the shape you want and lightly spray the dried petals with perfume if desired.



Bookmarks

You will need some card paper, crayons, markers, glue, a small thin wooden stick (maybe one from an ice cream), a small photograph of yours (optional) and some dried petals (optional again)

Cut a 15x4 cm card paper. Color and decorate it with the crayons, markers and if you want you can even paste your photograph or some dried petals on it. Take the stick and glue it behind the card. You can even paint the other side if you want.
